New hoarding announces Thrive Living to Tunbridge Wells

Construction update

We are nearing the end of the contractor procurement process and all is on track to have boots on the ground on our site next month. This translates to site cabins, hoarding adaptations and enabling works starting ahead of piling, and then breaking ground taking place beyond that.

In the interim, you may see construction vehicles come and go. We will continue to share construction updates as work progresses so watch this space.

Temporary closure of the Public Right of Way

With works starting on site in the new year, the Public Right of Way ("PROW") that bisects the ABC cinema site and provides pedestrian access between Clanricarde Road and Mount Pleasant Road will be closing in January 2024.

Rest assured that signage will be provided to direct pedestrians to alternative routes during this closure period and a realigned public right of way will be opened once construction is completed. This new route will run through the central courtyard of the new community being developed here, offering an opportunity for residents and the wider community to come together in a shared environment.
